MSCA have a €6.6 billion budget under Horizon Europe and support the mobility of researchers between countries, sectors and disciplines to acquire new knowledge, skills and competences.



Marie Skłodowska-Curie was a trailblazing scientist whose legacy is known around the world. She was famous not only for her pioneering work in chemistry and physics, for which she was awarded two Nobel prizes, but also for her dedication to breaking down gender barriers in teaching and education, and for her research-enabled humanitarian efforts in World War 1.

Her legacy extends into the EU's Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions - named in her honour because of the shared core values of excellence, mobility across borders and sectors, equality, and interdisciplinarity in research.

The Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions are a European Commission Funding Programme which fund researchers at all stages of their careers, across all research disciplines and in all sectors.
